**FAREWELL IN SONG....**The "Peace Be Still" Angelic Choir, one of the country's oldest and foremost Gospel groups, will give its farewell concert at 4 P. M. Sunday in the Recreational Life Center. Rev. Dr. Lawrence C. Roberts will direct the Angelic Choir which has recorded 47 albums and has earned numerous music awards including a Grammy. Tickets for the New Jersey Choir's concert are \$3 and are on sale in the Ticket Office in Dinneen Hall. The concert is being sponsored by Afro-American Studies, Educational Opportunity Fund Program, and Special Programs. In preparation for the concert, normal Recreational Life Center operations will be suspended on Sunday.

**BLACK OBSERVANCE....**The appearance of the Angelic Choir at Saint Peter's will be part of Black History Week on campus. In keeping with February's Black History Month observance, Afro-American Studies will present a "Teach-In in the Black Experience" from 9 A.M. to 2:30 P.M. tomorrow in Dinneen Auditorium. Maurice Heywood of the Sociology Department will take a look at the "Black Family" from 9 to 11 A.M.; William Perkins, a professor from Temple University will present a discussion on the "Politics and Leadership in the Black Community" from 11 A.M. to 12:30 P.M.; and Alfreida Augman, wife of Afro-American Studies Director Rev. William Augman, and Dean Trulear, professor at Jersey City State College, will focus on "Afro-Americans and the Arts" from 1 to 2:30 P.M. A wine and cheese reception will follow the "Teach-In" which is open to members of the College and the public.

**LENTEN ACTIVITIES....**Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and Campus Ministry has planned a series of services and events for the period leading to Easter. In observance of Ash Wednesday, ashes will be distributed at special liturgical services at 8:30 A.M. after 11 A.M. Mass, at noon, and again at 4:30 P.M. in McDermott Chapel. Also planned is a series on the "shifting relationships between men and women", which will begin at 8 P.M. Monday, February 13, in the Pavonia Room. Dr. Luisa de la Torre, Associate Professor of Spanish, and Rev. David Cusick, S.J., a member of the Campus Ministry team, will co-direct the series. Tuesday morning's traditional coffee and doughnuts in the Campus Ministry Office will give way during Lent to a "Breakfast", which will include a 9 A.M. prayer service, followed by coffee, tea, juice and homemade bread. Materials regarding fasting, recipes for meatless meals, and related information also will be available on Tuesday mornings. And before the Lenten season begins, Campus Ministry will observe Shrove Tuesday, (tomorrow) the day before the beginning of Lent, by offering Mardigras activities in the Campus Ministry Office, opposite McIntyre Lounge. Everyone at the College is invited to participate in the activities.

**TUITION INCREASE....**In a letter mailed last week to students, faculty and staff, Rev. Victor R. Yanitelli S.J., President, announced that the College will raise tuition \$8 per credit to avoid a deficit budget for fiscal year 1978-79. The tuition increase will go into effect with the 1978 Summer Session. Father Yanitelli noted that the tuition increase was one of several steps being taken by the College to off-set "the constant pressure of spiraling inflation." He said he will be working with the State Scholarship Commission to expand and increase student aid programs; the College will be working to obtain more funding from the State of New Jersey; and in his new role as Chancellor, he will devote his full-time to seeking new sources of support for endowment, salaries, scholarships and academic programs.

**WELL DONE....**Saint Peter's Ski Team pulled off a bit of an upset at the recent County College of Morris Tri-State Invitational Meet at Hidden Valley. The downhill racers captured third place in the meet and topped a field of eight teams representing New Jersey schools including Rutgers and Princeton.

**YEARBOOK DEDICATION....**The 1978 Peacock Pie will be dedicated to Nancy Campbell, Assistant Director of Admissions. The announcement was made by yearbook Editor Maureen Keenan and Rita Sorrenti, President of the Class of 1978, during last week's cocktail party for seniors and their partners. Ms. Campbell was cited for her work in admissions and her efforts as moderator of the College's Cheerleading Squad and the Senior class co-moderator

Candidates in the Class of 1981 should have a letter of intent submitted by Friday, March 3, a noon general meeting will be conducted that same day, and elections will be on Wednesday, March 8. Those wishing to run for the executive committee must submit a letter of intent by Friday, March 10, attend a general meeting at noon that day and elections are set for Wednesday, March 15.
