**MIME COMPANY....** "The Manhattan Mimes Ensem," a company which has performed its specialty throughout the United States over the last four years, will offer the College community a rare look at that art form during a visit to campus tomorrow. The two person company will conduct a mime performance at noon, and will follow it up with a workshop-demonstration at 2 P.M. Both presentations will be in Dinneen Auditorium. "The Manhattan Mimes Ensem" is being sponsored by Special Programs.

**FOCUS ON ALCOHOLISM....** Campus Ministry is offering a penetrating look at "Alcoholism" during a special presentation from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M. Wednesday. The program will be conducted in four parts: "The First Step," a film introducing the subject; "The Progression of the Disease of Alcoholism," a discussion by Rev. Peter Swiesgood, O.S.B.; "The Secret Love of Sandra Blain," a film which probes the issue of female alcoholism; and finally, college age speakers representing "Alcoholics Anonymous," and "Alanon" will offer their own commentary on the disease.

The menu will include the traditional spaghetti dinner, and will be preceded by a cocktail hour at 5 P.M. in the Pavonia and Hudson Rooms. Following dinner everyone will receive a complimentary ticket for the Saint Peter's versus Wagner basketball game in the Recreational Life Center.

**SEARS GRANT....** Saint Peter's College recently was awarded an \$1,800 unrestricted grant from the Sears-Roebuck Foundation for support of the College's development fund. The gift was one of 17 unrestricted grants made by Sears this year to private colleges in New Jersey. Francis J. Mertz, Executive Vice President, said the grant would be used for faculty development and student aid.

**WITH HEART....** Argus Eyes will again present "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum" at 8 P.M. Friday, Saturday and Sunday in Dinneen Theatre.
