**PRESIDENT'S DAY....**Classes will end at 2 P.M. Friday for the special President's Day for the faculty. Since it is difficult to call off lab sessions, Father McMullen asks science faculty to try to attend the President's Day activities sometime during the afternoon.

**MID-TERM GRADES....**Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors can pick up their mid-term grade reports from their departmental mentors beginning Thursday. A list of mentor assignments will be posted throughout the college. Seniors should also consult a graduation check list along with their mentors to make certain they have fulfilled all academic requirements necessary for graduation. Freshmen can pick up their mid-term grade reports from their mentors on Thursday and Friday.

**REGISTRAR'S NOTES....**Patrick Forte, registrar, reminds students that the final date for dropping courses is November 8 for upperclassmen and November 12 for freshmen. Also, any student missing a mid-term grade in a course for which he is registered should consult the registrar's office immediately. Students who have switched course sections without benefit of the official procedures will find that they are listed on the original section roster. Mr. Forte also advises students wishing to change majors that they must adhere to the published departmental mentor assignment list to acquire mid-term reports before they complete necessary change of major forms.

**PATERSON PHOTOGRAPHS....**A photographic exhibit by George Tice whose work appears in permanent collections at the Museum of Art, the Minneapolis Institute of Arts and Bibliotheque Nationale in Paris, will be on display Wednesday on the first floor in the Library. The collection "Paterson: Portrait of a City" is sponsored by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts Traveling Exhibitions Program and the Paterson Public Library. The 30 photographs in the exhibition will be part of Tice's forthcoming book Paterson.

Malara, assistant professor of English and George E. Martin instructor in political science.

**STATE APPOINTMENTS....**Francis J. Mertz has been named by the State Department of Higher Education to the Edwin E. Aldrin Commemorative Scholarships Advisory Council. Ten scholarships are designed to support science projects for college students. This past summer junior Nancy Cosentino received a grant under this program for research. Announcements concerning the program will be made shortly and the deadline for acceptance of applications will be early in 1972. Also, Alvin Weitz, adjunct assistant professor of education, has been named director of Vocational Program Development for the Division of Vocational and Technical Education for the New Jersey State Department of Education. Weitz was the former Supervisor of Business Education for the State.

The group discussed problems common to college level honors programs and formed the "Mid-Atlantic" region of which the college is a charter member.
