GOOD NEWS....Rev. Edmund G. Ryan, S.J., executive vice president last week announced a new salary scale for full and part-time faculty. Under the new scale, which will become effective with the start of the 1972 Summer Session, Full professors will receive \$15,000 to \$20,000 per year; associate professors, \$12,000 to \$17,000 per year; assistant professors, \$11,000 to \$15,000 per year, and instructors, \$10,000 to \$13,000 per year. Per credit compensation for adjunct faculty follows: Professor, \$250 to \$315; associate professor, \$220 to \$270; assistant professor, \$195 to \$240, and instructor, \$175 to \$215. Father Ryan also announced that the Budget Committee, at the request of the administration, has set aside \$10,000 to be granted as "Faculty Centennial Awards". The awards will be considered as a bonus and not as additions to base salaries. Rev. Aidan McMullen, S.J., acting academic dean, will publish guidelines for the awards after they are formulated by a committee made up of volunteers from the chairmen of departments and directors of programs. More information on the awards, salary scale and this year's increments is contained in a memo from Father Ryan. Copies are available in his office and from the heads of departments.

LIBRARY DIRECTOR....Dr. Richard D. Tetreau, who had been chief of acquisitions for Boston College libraries, has been named new director of the Theresa and Edward O'Toole Library. Dr. Tetreau has spent the last year editing Core Collection for College Libraries. He succeeds Rev. Edmund F.X. Ivers, S.J., the father of our library, who will remain as a professional librarian here assisting in the management of the acquisitions and book processing divisions.

ECUMENICAL APPROACH....Father Yanitelli will be on the lecture circuit for the Jewish Chatauqua Society in the coming weeks. He has speaking engagements before a total of six Jewish groups. He will address the brotherhoods at Temple Israel, Lawrence, N.Y., on February 7; Congregation B'nai Israel, Toms River, February 18; Temple Israel, Manhattan, February 20; the Jewish Young Couples Club in Fort Lee, February 22; Temple Emanu-El, Manhattan, February 27, and Temple Israel, Manhattan, March 10. Father also tells us he'll be squeezing in a communion breakfast here and there during that period.

NAVAL ENGAGEMENT...."Journals of the American Privateer Yankee" a article by History Professor Thaddeus V. Tuleja, appears in the current issue of the Naval War College Review. Dr. Tuleja had held the King Chair of Maritime History at the college.

RELIGION ON CAMPUS....Rev. Joseph P. Kelly, S.J., director of campus ministry, will moderate the second Centennial Conversation "Religion on the American Campus--What Is It?" at 2:30 P.M. tomorrow in McIntyre Lounge. Participating in the panel discussion will be students from the college, Fairfield University, Rutgers and Yale. The conversation is open to the entire college community.

MCCARTHY SPEAKS....Eugene McCarthy, candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination, will be on campus next Tuesday for participation in the first centennial Symposium. [Joining McCarthy for the panel discussion on "A Liberal Education Today" will be Rev. Timothy S. Healy, S.J., vice chancellor for academic affairs for the City University of New York and Dr. Ruth M. Adams, president of Wellesley College. There will be two sessions in Dinneen Auditorium the first at 2 P.M. and the second at 8:15 P.M.

FRESHMEN ASSEMBLY....Freshmen are urged to attend a class assembly at 1 P. M. today in Dinneen Hall to discuss the upcoming elections.

FEMINIST SEMINARS....A series of seminars designed to probe the question "is There Life After Marriage?" will begin at 1 P.M. today in Dinneen 334. Speakers for today's lecture are Marie Kaminski, instructor of psychology at Caldwell College, who will discuss "Psychology of Women" Roxanne Hiltz, assistant professor of sociology at Upsala College who will examine the role of "Women At Work" and Dr. Renee Kogel, assistant professor of history who will provide a "Historical Look At Women." The series is sponsored by the Counseling Center.
