FAMILY AFFAIR....The college will launch its centennial celebration New Year's Day with a special Mass and reception on campus. Persons who have contributed to the planning of the centennial will be the guests of the college along with their families. Special guests include Rev. Dennis J. Comey, S.J., Rev. Joseph S. Dinneen, S.J., Rev. Vincent Hart, S.J., Rev. James J. Shanahan, S.J., Rev. Edward F. Clark, S.J., and Rev. Leo V. McLaughlin, S.J., the past six living presidents of the college and Rev. Robert I. Gannon, S.J., who was dean of the college in the early 1930's. The Mass will be preceded by the raising of the centennial flag which will fly over the campus throughout 1972.

*****CENTENNIAL CONCERT*****
Henry Lewis and the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra will perform the first of two centennial concerts at 8 P.M. Saturday, January 22, in Margaret Williams Auditorium in Jersey City State College. Guest artist will be honorary alumnus Cyril Ritchard who will narrate Prokofieff's "Peter and the Wolf." Other selections include DeFalla's "Three Cornered Hat Suite," "Flute and Harp Concerto" by Mozart and Stravinsky's "Firebird Suite." Tickets for the concert are available at the college ticket office at \$5 and \$2.50 for students.
