**COLLEGE TELEVISION SERIES....**Beginning today the college will screen the first of ten video tape programs produced specifically to promote discussion and thought among college students. The series "The New Consciousness" featuring such outspoken and thought-provoking participants as Ralph Nader, John Kerry and Bernadette Devlin opens at 1:00 and 5:15 P.M. in Pope Lecture Hall. "Waiting For The Change," the first program in the series features a look at repression in America today. Ralph Nader's plan for enlisting college students in his efforts, an examination of the drug scene, some humorous information from Abbie Hoffman and a visit to a meeting of the Gay Activist Alliance. The program will be repeated at noon Wednesday and again at 5:15 P.M. Thursday. The remainder of the ten shows which include "Do You Own Your Own Body?" "Banned In The USA-Dick Gregory's Vietnam Film," and "The Black Man And The System" will be aired at these same times. Check dateline for announcements on future programs.
